In my doctoral work, I am examining political participation and deliberative democracy, with a focus on Canada. As a teaching assistant, I am responsible for creating weekly activities for my assigned course (Introduction to Electoral Systems) and for providing guidance and feedback to undergraduate students. My work as a research assistant is varied and also quite interesting.
