Course Substitutions:

Students registered in modules that require 2200-level Economics courses may NOT take the 2100-level versions of these courses and count them toward their modules. Generally, 2200-level Economics courses are not offered during summer school. If you are registered in a Major or HSP, and intend to go to summer school, you must plan to take non-Economics courses.

Students who have completed the appropriate 2100-level Economics courses before admission to a Major or HSP with a minimum grade of 70% in each, and a minimum average for those courses of 75%, may be admitted to the Honors Specialization or Major modules if they meet the first-year admission requirements for the HSP and Major modules.

Progression Requirements

To progress in the HSP Economics module, students **must**

- a) maintain a minimum modular average of 70%
- b) obtain minimum grades of 60% in all courses listed for the module
- c) obtain a passing grade in each elective course
- d) maintain a minimum cumulative average of 65%.

Students who **fail** to meet these progression requirements will be **removed** from the HSP Econ program.

Students are responsible for the accuracy and completeness of their program.

Note: Economics 2123B normally required Economics 2122A as a prerequisite, and Economics 2223B normally required Economics 2222A as a prerequisite. However, starting September 2020, students with a minimum grade of 70% in Statistics 2035 may enroll directly in Econ 2123A/B or 2223A/B. See [details](#).
