Major in Middle East Studies

A major in Middle East Studies reflects the programming possibilities that arise from a newly-established synergy of academic expertise in the Middle East on Western main campus and at King's University College, especially in history, philosophy, and religious studies.

Admission Requirements:

- Completion of first-year requirements. It is recommended that students in first year take a first-year History course and a language course in one of Arabic, Persian or Hebrew.

** The History Department (Western) will maintain a list of special topics courses that can fulfill the requirements for this module.

Rules Governing Course Overlaps for the Middle East Studies Major

Upon request a maximum of 1.0 course credit may be allowed towards fulfilling the requirements of the Middle East Studies Major for courses taken at the 2000 level or above, if the course is eligible for credit under the rules of the Middle East Studies Major, even if the course has been credited towards a different module. Please note that this does not lower the total number of courses needed to meet graduation requirement.
