This Certificate program will ensure students gain valuable experience applying their knowledge as they carry out their own independent and/or group research projects.

Admission Requirements:

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures and a minimum cumulative average of 65%. Students must also be registered in a module in Sociology or Criminology.
