

KING'S UNIVERSITY COLLEGE
SOCIOLOGY & CRIMINOLOGY – MODULE CHECKLIST (Effective September 2026)

*** IMPORTANT INFORMATION ***

Sociology/Criminology module combinations that are NOT permitted:

- Three-Year BA, Major Sociology/Minor Criminology
- Honours BA, HSP Sociology/Major Criminology
- Three-Year BA, Major Criminology/Minor Sociology
- Honours BA, HSP Criminology/Major Sociology

As per Western's senate regulations, students are not permitted to count more than 9.0 Sociology courses towards a 3-Year BA, and no more than 14.0 Sociology courses towards an Honours BA or 4-Year BA. The combinations listed above exceed the number of Sociology courses allowable and therefore are not permitted.

Overlapping Courses Between Sociology Modules

Students who are enrolled in a Major in Sociology and a Major in Criminology may overlap 1.0 course: [Sociology 2205A/B](#) *Statistics for Sociology* and [Sociology 2206A/B](#) *Research Methods in Sociology* to fulfill the statistics and methodology requirements for both majors. [Sociology 2240E](#) *Survey of Sociological Theory* or [Sociology 2270A/B](#) *Foundations of Social Theory* and [Sociology 2271A/B](#) *Survey of Contemporary Theory*, however, will be counted as fulfilling the requirements of one of these two modules; for the other major, students must take an additional 1.0 Sociology course at the 2200-level or above. **Students registered in an HONOURS Double Major in Sociology AND Criminology must have at least 0.5 at the 4000-level in Sociology at King's.**

The Department does not permit any course overlap between a Minor module offered by the Department of Sociology and any other module offered by the Department.

HONOURS SPECIALIZATION IN SOCIOLOGY

Enrolment in this module is limited. Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.

Admission Requirements:

- Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses including **Sociology 1020, 1020W/X or 1021E**, plus 2.0 additional courses, with no mark in these principal courses below 60%.
