Important Dates and Deadlines:

The 1st Installment of fees for International students is due between August 1st – August 15th. Late fees will be applied after August 15th, 2024.

August 15 th	⇒ O-Week opt-out DEADLINE for Full-Time, First Year students
August 23 rd	⇒ International Work Experience (IWE) Program application opens.
September 23 rd	⇒ USC Health and Dental Plan opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm ⇒ Student Endowment fee opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm ⇒ My Virtual Doctor opt-out DEADLINE by 11:30pm ⇒ IWE Program application DEADLINE
September 30 th	⇒ Scholarship and Bursary application deadline for most in-program awards at King's
