



Boredom Busters: Learning About the Bible

For a book that we read often and every Sunday at Mass, there may be some interesting information that you don't know about it. Did you know that God speaks to you through the Bible? Every time we listen to the readings at Mass or read the Bible at home it is God speaking to us. We believe that the Bible is actually God's word to us! This is why we say "The Word of the Lord" at the end of the readings. While God did not sit down and write the Bible, he did guide the people who wrote it so that they would know what to write and could put the Bible together for us. In the Bible, there are many different kinds of books which include stories, songs, letters, parables, sayings, laws, prophecies, histories and other types of writing! The Bible is very long because it works to reveal everything about God! The Old Testament, which is the first section of the Bible, describes everything before Jesus' birth. The New Testament describes Jesus' birth, life, ministry, death and resurrection. See if you can find a children's Bible around your house and look at the different parts of the Bible. Each day try to read one Bible story and you will see how God helped his people along the way to eventually get us where we are today!
