PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Ready to make a real difference? King's Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) prepares you for a rewarding career in social work, helping individuals, families, groups and communities overcome barriers to health and wellness. Through a combination of classroom learning and over 700 professional practicum hours, you'll gain hands-on experience in social service organizations under professional supervision. In your first year, you'll complete approximately 210 hours, and in your second year, up to 525 hours. This hands-on experience helps you develop essential skills for social work practice across diverse settings.

The Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) program begins in third year. Please see your academic advisor about choosing required courses if you are entering first year at King's. Students from college or other universities may also apply. Contact the School of Social Work for information about transfer courses and pathways into upper years at King's and the BSW program.

BSW Curriculum and Professional Development

The BSW program at King's provides a comprehensive curriculum designed to equip you with the knowledge and professional skills needed for a successful career in social work. You'll develop expertise in key areas through coursework and hands-on experience, preparing you to work in diverse health and social service settings.

Pre-BSW Social Work Courses

Prior to admission to the professional BSW program, students will have completed in first and second year:

- Introduction to Social Work and Social Welfare (minimum 70%)
- Introduction to Social Work Practice and Communication Skills (minimum 70%)
- Research Methods for Social Workers or equivalent. (minimum 60%)
- Introduction to Generalist Social Work Practice and Theories (minimum 70%)
- Additional prerequisites in writing, humanities and social sciences

Students must achieve a minimum 70% average across 10.0 pre-entry credits to be eligible to apply. Meeting the minimum does not guarantee admission.

Pathway and Career Opportunities:

King's BSW (Honours) graduates are employed in a wide variety of practice fields and settings. Some will choose to pursue a graduate degree in Social Work (MSW) or pursue a different graduate degree or professional program like a Juris Doctorate (JD) in Law, either upon completion of their BSW (Honours) or following experience in professional practice.

BSW graduates are eligible to become registered social workers upon graduation. Our graduates are working in a variety of fields, including:

- **Health & Mental Health Services:** Hospitals, Long-Term Care, Addiction Services
- **Family & Youth Support:** Family Services, Child & Youth Services, Women's Advocacy
- **Justice & Public Policy:** Justice & Corrections, Dispute Resolution, Government Agencies
- **Community & Education:** School Boards, Non-Profit Organizations, Community Development
